

# THE MacDUFFIE CLASS



Miss Eldora MacDuffie was born June 10, 1870 in Patele Grove, Wisconsin. While a young girl her parents moved to Ottawa. Her father died when she was twelve. She graduated from Ottawa High School in 1887 at the age of 17.

She was old for her age and took much of the responsibility for her home and family. In 1887 she began teaching a class of young boys and as they aged they became a class of young men

She taught the class 31 years and in 1918 she became ill and moved to Oklahoma City near her sister and died in 1919.

For many years she was an employee of Davenport Drygoods Co. and although she worked late Saturday night she was always at her task of teaching the class Sunday morning.

In 1922 her class gathered for a memorial service. In 1931 fifty members of her class again gathered to honor her. In November of 1954, the MacDuffie Men's Bible Class met for a reunion.

## The Koininia Class

In 1963, the "Koininia Class" was organized for young married couples. Rev. Charles Knight was the pastor at this time. Over the years Joel Nordeen, Allen Unruh, and Jack Bushman were teachers. They were active in service projects as well as social activities. The class disbanded in the 90s.



**Oxford Service Forum**  
The Oxford Service Forum Class began meeting in the Fall of 1945 during the pastorate of Rev. R.K. Sutton. It was a class for returning military personnel, college students and young working people. Older adults in the church taught the class until Evelyn Alden became their full time teacher. Later, the class started taking turns teaching themselves.

## The Friendly Class

In January of 1921, while Rev. Harry W. Case was Pastor, the "Friendly Class" – a class for "Young Married People"-- was organized with seven members. It was originally named the "Young Married People's Class". One year later it had 46 members and the name was changed to "The Friendly Class". In 1936 there were about 200 members. For many years the class was taught by Rev. H.A. Cook. After 38 years, the class disbanded in 1959.

## The What-So-Ever Class

This class was organized for young ladies soon after the dedication of the new church. Lulu Belle MacDuffie was one of the early teachers. She was the younger sister of Eldora MacDuffie and taught the class until her marriage to A.C. (Bert) Hansen in 1911 when she moved to Oklahoma City.

## The Reta Class

In 1918 the What-So-Ever Class was divided with the unmarried women forming their own class. It was originally called the "Margueritas" and Reta Woolf was the teacher. The class eventually became known as the "Reta Class". At one time there were 35 members and by 1978 there were 25 members. In 1983, the Reta Class disbanded and members rejoined the What-So-Ever Class.

## Joy/Open Door Sunday School Class

While Rev. Russell Fosmire was pastor, The "Joy Sunday School Class" was organized. In 1958 it became known as the "Open Door Class". The class disbanded in 1960.

## The Horizon Class

The "Horizon Class" was started in 1982 under the name of "Pairs and Spares". Jerry Harnden was Pastor. It was a class for married couples as well as "singles". In 1991 the name of the class was changed to "Horizon".

## TweenAgers and Pairs and Spares

"TweenAgers" and a new "Pairs and Spares" Class were both begun in the 1990's and in 2003 they joined together and became known as the "Seekers".

## Wesley Class

The Wesley Class was formed in 1965 for college students. It no longer exists.

## Present Sunday School Classes.

At the present time there are 4 adult Sunday School Classes: The Sunshine Class, The Oxford Service Forum, The Horizon Class and The Seekers.



## Disciple Bible Study

Rev. Kent Melcher began teaching this Bible Study class as an in-depth view of the Bible that provided historical context in addition to being an aid to understanding. It is taught as a "Living Word" that is still relevant today.
